We completed pen, pencil, raincoat, and book projects; itemized as Pens 23,745, Pencils 17,062, and Raincoats 5,200. We recently shipped a 40 ft. container of books for a project entitled "Books for Knowledge and Empowerment" to establish community libraries in

the remote areas of Oroko land in Cameroon. Books for Africa partnered with us to ship a 40 ft. container of books to Cameroon. In addition, International Goodwill books donated and shipped 10, 000 books to Cameroon. We believe that with the assortment books the students can empower themselves with knowledge and break the circle of poverty and ignorance, paving the way for a better future. With support of Books for Africa, shipment sponsorship of First Presbyterian and individuals, we were able to ship over 40, 000 books to Cameroon to establish reading rooms/libraries in Oroko areas.
